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## Report on National Voters' Day, 2023

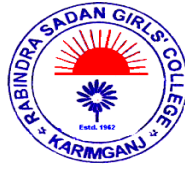

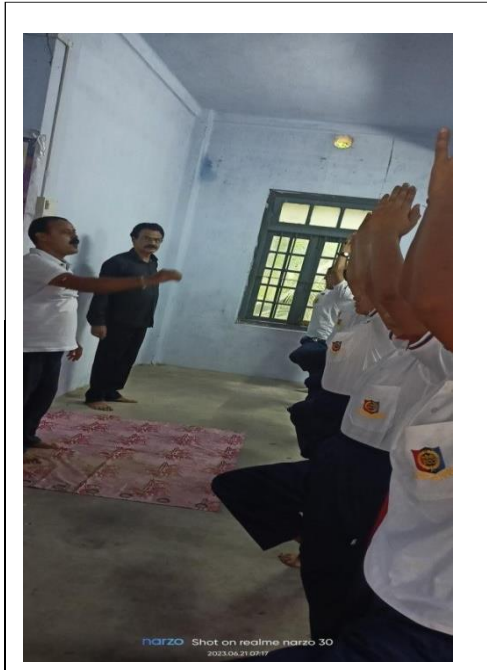

## **SURVEY DONE BY NSS, RSGC, Karimganj on the 21.03.2022**

(at Dinesh Chandra Dev Smriti Children Home, Karnamudu, Dist-Karimganj)

The NSS Team, RSGC, Karimganj surveyed the said Children Home, which consists of 23 children on record available with the society. The Home is meant for only boys between 6-18 years of age. Sri. Sourob Kemprai, Superintendent, who is a caretaker of the Children Home, Sri. Santosh Kumar Dey (President, NGO) Sri. Debasish Chandra Dev as the Secretary I/C, Sangeeta Paul (Counsellor), Biswajit Kar (House Father, Pranat Das (Cook), Satya Prasanta Das (House Keeper), Ranjit Das (Helper), Binendo Paul (Night Guard).

The building occupied by them is on rental basis. However, 90% of the total expenditure incurred to run the Home is borne by State Child Protection Society, Assam and 10% share of the total expenditure incurred is borne by the Society which runs the Children Home. This children Home is monitored by District Child Protection Office, Karimganj and Child Welfare Committee, Karimganj.

### **Findings:**

1. The Survey Team felt the necessity of giving them garments and sports materials for the distressed children.
2. Health of the children is in good condition.
3. Portable filtration drinking water facility is available.
4. One of the children (Dhruba Das) has passed out HSLC Examination recently.
5. It is found that the children felt homely, safe and secured.
6. Building consists of 8 rooms including kitchen. Adequate beds are available for the existing strength of children.
7. The Home is surrounded by boundary wall. But, the wall is made of temporary tin, which is not safe and secure for the children from the intruders.
8. Another new building is being under construction annexed to the old building.

The survey was undertaken by NSS Volunteers, RSGC under the guidance of Dr. Ashok Kr Das, Principsl, RSGC, Kxj, Mr. L Hmar, Program Officer, NSS and Sri S Kr Seal.
