- A student will have to opt for a MODERN INDIAN LANGUAGE (MIL) or ALTERNATIVE ENGLISH. However, only the subjects like Bengali and Alternative English are taught in the college. A student who opted for the MIL subjects other than Bengali will have to take permission from the Assam Higher Secondary Education Council, Guwahati.

A student has to opt 3 (three) Elective Subjects from the following.

- Either, Economics or Education;
- Either, History or Mathematics;
- Either, Advance Bengali or Sanskrit;
- Either, Pol. Science or Statistics;
- Logic & Philosophy
- Computer science & Application; (self financed)

However, one more subject in addition to the three elective subjects may be opted as 4th subject that may replace any of the three subjects if a student secure undue mark in the examination on it.

COMBINATION OF SUBJECTS

A student can take the following subjects.

- English is compulsory subject.
- A student will have to opt for a MODERN INDIAN LANGUAGE (MIL) or ALTERNATIVE ENGLISH. However, only the subjects like Bengali and Alternative English are taught in the college. A student who opted for the MIL subjects other than Bengali will have to take permission from the Assam Higher Secondary Education Council, Guwahati.
- Accountancy
- Business Studies

A student has to opt 1 (one) Elective Subjects from the following.

- Commercial Mathematics and Statistics;
- Economics;
- Mathematics;
- Computer Science & Application

However, one more subject in addition to the three elective subjects may be opted as 4th subject that may replace any of the three subjects if a student secures undue mark in the examination on it.

COMBINATION OF SUBJECTS

A student can take the following subjects.

English is compulsory subject.

A student will have to opt for a MODERN INDIAN LANGUAGE (MIL) or ALTERNATIVE ENGLISH. However, only the subjects like Bengali and Alternative English are taught in the college. A student who opted for the MIL subjects other than Bengali will have to take permission from the Assam Higher Secondary Education Council, Guwahati.

TDC. (CBCS), Pass and Honours Course

Assam University, Silchar vide its notification no AUK-203/2/2004 dated 21st May 2018 has implemented Choice Based Credit System (CBCS) for undergraduate courses in its affiliated colleges from the academic session 2018-19. The detail of CBCS system is available in the University website. aus.ac.in. The students seeking admission in TDC (BA, B.Com) 1st Semester are asked to access the university website for information.

PROGRAMME OF STUDY UNDER CBCS:

The programme of study to be called as three-year Degree Course (TDC) under Choice Based Credit System (CBCS) and in short **TDC (CBCS)**, shall be a 6-semester programme of 3 (three) years' duration and, there shall be 2 (two) programmes under TDC (CBCS) namely, **TDC (CBCS) Honours** and **TDC (CBCS) General**.

Maximum duration for the completion of a TDC (CBCS) programme of study is **5 (five) years at a stretch from the date of admission** (i.e., 10 (ten) consecutive End Semester Examinations) as per the "Guidelines on Determination of a Uniform Span Period within which a Student may be allowed to Qualify for a Degree" published by UGC dated October 15, 2015. This criterion shall be strictly adhered to while determining the eligibility to appear in any ESE for Arrear Paper/s, and Betterment Examination.

ELIGIBILITY FOR ADMISSION:

Candidates for admission to the FIRST SEMESTER of TDC (CBCS) shall be required to have passed the Higher Secondary (+2) or its equivalent Examinations conducted by any recognized University / Board / Council, Which shall be treated as qualifying examination.

Provided that candidates for admission into the specific programme of study shall also possess such other qualifying conditions as may be prescribed by the University or concerned college.

ADMISSION AND REGISTRATION TO FIRST SEMESTER:

Admissions shall be conducted through online process only by logging on to the college Website: www.rabindrasadangirlscollege.in

A Candidate shall register himself / herself with Assam University during his / her admission to First Semester as a registered student of the University through **online process** and by paying requisite amount of Registration Fee.

Previously registered students of other Board / Council / Higher Educational Institution / University shall have to submit Original Copy of Migration Certificate while applying for registration under Assam University, Silchar except for those students who have passed the last examination from Assam Higher Secondary Educational Council, Guwahati, Assam.

In the TDC (CBCS) programme of study, a student **SHALL NOT BE ALLOWED TO CHANGE** either from TDC (CBCS) **Honours** to TDC (CBCS) General or vice-versa during any semester of the programme. However, Principal of a college with the recommendation of concerned HOD/s may allow a First semester student **once** for such change **before submission of Registration Forms to the University**. Change of course / subject may be allowed as per similar procedure within stipulated period as mentioned herein. Previous attendance shall be taken into consideration in such cases.



Colleges may design a form for the students to apply for such change, and the last date of submission of such form to be announced by notification.

To drop Honours or to change course/subject after the stipulated period as mentioned above, a student may get re-admitted in First semester, subject to the availability of seats as per Rule 12 to continue with his/her studies in TDC (CBCS) programme of study.

RE-ADMISSION UNDER PREVIOUS REGISTRATION NUMBER:

A student once registered under Assam University for TDC (CBCS) programme of study, shall **NOT** be allowed to get admission with new Registration Number - however, the student may get admission in the First semester of TDC (CBCS) in the same college or in other colleges during scheduled time of admission observing all admission formalities (submission of form, payment of fees etc.), subject to the availability of seats / TDC (CBCS) programme of study and, such admission shall be considered **as re-admission under previous Registration Number of the University**.

For re-admitted students the maximum duration for the completion of the programme of study shall be the same as per Rule 10.3., i.e., **5 (five) years from the date of re-admission**.

Such re-admitted student shall forfeit previous marks under CCA and shall have to attend all classes (Theory/Tutorial/Practical) and appear Unit Tests/End semester Examinations as a regular student. There shall **NOT** be any provision for private or casual category under CBCS.

ADMISSION TO HIGHER SEMESTER AFTER END SEMESTER EXAMINATION:

Admission to immediate next higher semester (II / III / IV / V / VI semester) after each End Semester Examination (ESE) shall be mandatory for each and every student with or without "Arrear Paper/s".

A student who fails to get admission in any higher semester for any valid reason may get admission in immediate next similar semester (odd or even).

CREDIT UNDER CBCS:

The Assam University shall follow the following UGC Guidelines to adopt relation of credit to Lecture-Tutorial-Practical (L-T-P):

1 (one) Lecture (L) = 1 (one) hour duration per week = 1 (one) Credit

1 (one) Tutorial (T) = 1 (one) hour duration per week = 1 (one) Credit

1 (one) Practical (P) = 2 (two) hour duration per week = 1 (one) Credit

CREDIT REQUIREMENTS:

Minimum credit requirement to complete the **TDC (CBCS) Honours Programme** shall be **148** and that under the **TDC (CBCS) General Programme** shall be **132**.



ATTENDANCE:

Each student shall have to attend a minimum of 75% Lectures / Tutorials / Practical classes in each paper of all the courses as per the recommended Course Structure of the concerned programme of study.

TDC 2nd & 3rd years: Provisional admission is to be taken within 7 days after the end of the examination and the final admission will be held after the announcement of the result.



Fees for self financed courses as per Govt. notification, Dt. 10/06/20

1. The students who would be taking Mass Communication as one of the subjects in BA, TDC classes have to pay Rs.4000/- per year.
2. The students who would be taking Computer Science as one of the subjects in HS 1st have to pay Rs.2000/- per year.
3. The students who would be taking Commerce as their stream, have to pay Rs. 1000/- per year for HS and Rs. 1500/- for B.Com per year.

As per Govt. notification No. AHE.639/2018/16 dated 10/06/2020, no fees will be taken from the candidates except self financed courses. Hence, the students opted for the above subjects/stream have to deposit the fees either in cash in college office or may deposite the amount in the college bank account within 2nd July 2020 to 10th July 2020.

RULES & DICIPLINE**Admission**

1. Merit is a prime criterion for admission into all courses.
2. Certain percentages of seats are reserved for different categories as per government rules.
3. Few seats are also reserved for sports persons and social workers recognized by the governments.
4. However, admission fee is relaxed to a students except self financed course/stream as per government norms/rules.
5. For both Honours and pass, 1st Semester (2020-21), the prescribed regulation provided by "Assam University TDC CBCS Regulations 2018" will be followed.
6. Mobile is strictly prohibited within the college campus.

Class

Regarding, H.S. and TDC Classes for this academic session, students are advised to access the college website and college facebook account regularly.

Examinations

1. **For T.D.C.**, (as per Assam University's directives) each student will have to sit in two Unit Test Examinations (20 marks in each subject) in each semester and must have to secure at least 8 (eight) marks in each subject in the Unit Test for qualifying herself for filling up of final examination form. Every Semester (Final) Examination is conducted by the University.
2. **For H.S.**, each student will have to sit in two Unit Test Examinations (20 marks in each subject) in each year and one separate final examination of 500/600 (with 4th subject) marks (with practical papers, if any) at the end of each year. First Year Final Examination is conducted by the college as per Council's Guide Line and the Second Year Final Examination is conducted by Assam Higher Secondary Education Council.



Distribution of Marks & Number of Class Lectures

1. Distribution of Marks and number of lectures to be delivered in particular topic are designed in accordance with the Syllabi of the University/Council

Attendance

1. As per AHSEC & Assam University Rules, students' attendance to classes is strictly maintained.
2. For T.D.C, a student must have a minimum of 75% attendance of lectures delivered in each subject separately for appearing the University Examinations. However, a minimum of 60% of attendance may be considered with prior permission from the University.
3. For, H.S, a student must have a minimum of 75% attendance of lectures delivered in each subject separately for attaining eligibility to appear in the Council's Examinations as Collegiate. However, a minimum of 60% of lectures delivered in each subject separately for attaining eligibility to appear in the Council's Examinations as Non-Collegiate.

Discipline

1. College Uniform: Students should come to the college with Uniform (Pink color of Salwar-Kameez half-sleeved and Dopatta, churidar panjabi). Any student who comes without Uniform will not be allowed to sit in the class.
2. Use of mobile/cellphone within the campus is strictly prohibited for students.
3. Students who repeatedly make noise in the class room may be expelled from the class for the day. If such students continue to do so in the coming days, necessary step may be taken against her by the disciplinary committee.
4. Students who behave unruly in the campus will be reported to the disciplinary committee for necessary action.
5. Any student who practices unfair means in the examination will be strictly dealt with as per the University/Council Rules.
6. Any student who breaks the law of the land within the campus will have to be booked their cases as per laws.

Prohibition of Ragging

Ragging is strictly prohibited. As per prohibition of Ragging Act/Ordinance, the details of punishments for ragging have been cited below.

1. Cancellation of admission; Suspension from attending classes; Withholding, withdrawing scholarship/fellowship and other benefits; Debarring from appearing examinations; Withhold result; Debarring from representing the institution; Fine up to Rs. 25,000/-; Rigorous imprisonment up to 3 yrs.
2. However, the appropriate authority of the college can award all the above punishments except the last punishment, which can be awarded only by the court of law.



Hostel's Rules

1. The college authority appointed a Superintendent for hostel. The superintendent would look after the affairs of Hostel in consultation with the Principal.
2. The boarders are kept under the care of two Prefects, either nominated by the hostel committee or elected by the boarders from among themselves. Prefects are responsible to take care of the boarders as well as ventilate the problems to the hostel committee.
3. Once a student is allotted hostel accommodation, she will have to abide by the rules and regulations of the Hostel framed by the committee and violation of which will lead to expulsion from the Hostel.
4. Any student who is expelled from the college or debarred from appearing the examination would instantly lead to the expulsion from the Hostel and her caution money will not be refunded.
5. Boarders are not allowed to disturb each other in the hostel. Making of unruly noise, shouting, mocking to others is strictly prohibited.
6. No one should infringe the rights/liberties of other(s) in the enjoyment of one's own rights/liberties.
7. No boarder will be allowed to go home or out of the hostel for the night(s) without prior permission from the competent authority. For the safety and security of girl students, none is allowed to go out/come in alone, unless she is accompanied by her guardian.
8. No boarder is allowed to go out of the hostel or come in, after dusk without prior permission.
9. If anybody caused damages to any property of the college/hostel, the cost of such damage(s) will be borne/compensated by the accused. Further action may be taken by the concerned committee, if necessary.
10. A boarder has to clear monthly mess dues in time and failing which may lead to debar from dining hostel mess.
11. None of the hostel boarder is allowed to have separate messing in her room.
12. No outsider/guest/guardian of the students will be allowed for night hold/stay in the Hostel or join the hostel meal without prior permission.
13. Use of Electronic Iron/Heater/Oven is strictly prohibited.
14. Guardians can meet the boarder(s) with due permission from the authority.
15. It is the duty of the Prefects to inform the Hostel Committee of any hostel-related issues. Accordingly, the Hostel Committee must either settle or forward such cases to higher authority, if necessary.

Facilities

The College has a Girls' Hostel within the campus with the capacity of more than 150 boarders. The 'Hostel Committee' takes the responsibility of its overall management. One Hostel Superintendent is appointed by the college authority who look after the affairs of the hostel in consultation with the Principal.

The boarders are kept under the care of two Prefects, either nominated by the hostel committee or elected by the boarders from among themselves. The Prefects take care of the boarders. The provision of 'Guardian-student waiting Room' is arranged in the Hostel for the convenience of the guardians/parents to meet their children. The Hostel has a Recreation Hall for the students refresh/enjoy their leisure time. The boarders dine in a common mess. Menu of the mess is chosen according to the wish of the boarders as recommended by the committee.



The college has a well-equipped Air Conditioned, digitized Library with more than 19,500 (nineteen thousand five hundred) academic related Books besides many Journals, Daily News Papers of local, regional and national. It keeps the entire past question papers to make use of it for self-preparedness to students.

Library has provided Computers with free internet Access to Students. There is a 'Reading Room' in the library with its sitting capacity of more than 50 students at a time. Two digital TVs are also installed to enrich the knowledge of the students with day-to-day news.

It also has a Xerox machine and a printer to make use of it by the students.

The above facilities are especially meant for students and teachers. Both teachers and students can borrow books from the library as per rules frame by the library committee from time to time.

Students will have to pay fine for any damage or loss of books and also for delay in returning the books. Students will have to return the books that they have borrowed and get library clearance before filling up of final examination form.



Hostel's Admission Procedure

1. The students opted for hostel may submit their willingness in the online admission portal and upload their documents as per requirement.
2. Seats are allotted on merit cum distance basis.
3. However, certain seats are reserved for SC, ST and OBC as per government norms/rules. Limited seats are also kept reserved by the college for Science, Commerce, BCA, Mass-Com and sport persons and social workers recognized by the governments.
4. A student who is once allotted for hostel accommodation will have to abide by Hostel Rules and violation of which will lead to expulsion.
5. Seat rent for one year will have to be paid at the time of hostel admission and in no way, it is refundable if once paid. Caution money so collected from each boarder will be refunded at the time of her leaving the Hostel.

Scholarship (3 type of scholarship)

1. Scholarship Sponsored by Governments. Different kinds of scholarship are provided to eligible students belonging to ST & SC; OBC, Minority and Meritorious Students.
2. Scholarship Sponsored by the College: Scholarship is provided (from College Poor Fund) to students hailing from downtrodden/backward families.
3. Scholarship Sponsored by the well-wishers: Sri. Manuj Jain in memory of his departed father Lt. Sampat Lal Jain, Proprietor of Jain Brothers Enterprise, Station Road, Karimganj, sponsors scholarship to students. Lions Club of Karimganj Unit sponsors Rs. 5000/- to a poor meritorious student of Degree 1st Year Class. The same student will continue to receive each year provided she continue to secure at least 60% marks in each previous examination.

Awards/Prizes Sponsored by Well-wishers

1. Shaktipada Das Memorial Award: This award is given to a student who obtained highest mark in Economics (Hons), with the average marks of at least 55% in B.A Final Year Examination is awarded.
2. Late Samir Kumar Dey Memorial Fund: A scholarship is awarded every year, out of the annual interest accrued from this fund to the best student of English Honours securing highest aggregate marks in B.A in all Six Semesters.
3. Late Dr. Sujit Choudhury Memorial Merit Scholarship: A scholarship is awarded every year, in the name of Lt. Dr. Sujit Choudhury Memorial Merit Scholarship, out of the annual interest accrued from fixed deposit to the highest scorer of marks in H.S and B.A Final examinations respectively.
4. Kamini-Swarnamoyee Memorial Award: The student obtaining highest marks in Bengali (Hons.) in B.A Final Examination is awarded in cash out of the interest accrued from this fund.
5. Bhura Endowment Lecture and Indranath Dutta Trust Fund: The bank interest accrued from this fund is utilized periodically in organizing lecture on Tagore by eminent scholars.



STUDENTS' WELFARE/POOR FUND

The college maintains students' welfare fund to provide financial help to the poor and deserving students, subject to the availability of funds.

RECREATION CENTRE

The college provides Recreation Centre for both students and teaching & non-teaching staff. The centre is maintained by Recreation Committee. Students are especially advised to utilise the same for mental and physical fitness during their leisure time or off period.

COLLEGE CANTEEN

There are two well & fine college canteens within the Campus. There is a Committee to censor the quality and prices of the items. Canteens are given out on lease as the leasees are to abide by the rules framed by the committee from time to time. Different kinds of food item are available with reasonable/cheap rate.

GYM CENTRE

The college provides a gymnasium centre in the college meant for interested students. Student used to take physical exercises during off period and after their normal classes. It is kept open for student during office hours.

STUDENTS' TRAVEL CONCESSION

Railway Concession Form is provided to students through the concerned department, for the purchase of journey ticket with low cost for the purpose of going and coming from home during vacations

STUDENTS' COMMON ROOM

For the convenience of the students, the college has provided a Students' Common Room. The students make use of this room for rehearsal, meeting, certain indoor games, self-refresh, relax and etc.

SMART CLASS ROOM (Air Conditioned)

The college has one air conditioned smart class room. Sound system (Audio-visual system) is installed in all big rooms. Class rooms are designed with eco-friendly to the environment. However, a smart class room is equipped with digitalized projector, computer and audio-visual system.

DRINKING WATER FACILITY

The college provided drinking water facility to the stake holders of this college all-round the clock. Ultra violet purifiers are installed in the office, Principal chamber, teachers' common room, students' common room, library, canteen and etc.

UNINTERRUPTED POWER SUPPLY

The college is fully electrified. However, for precautionary measure, the college owned a KiloKer Power Generator of 20 KV. Thus, uninterrupted power supply is provided to all class & office rooms and hostel of the college all-round the clock

COLLEGE MOBILE APP

The college has its own mobile app(Google Playstore). The app allows the easy interface for students to access information, interact with faculty and other students.



CCTV SURVEILLANCE

College has installed CCTV for the safety and security of all the staffs, students and visitors of this college. The entire campus is under the coverage of CCTV surveillance.

STUDENTS CAREER COUNSELLING

Students are motivated in such a way that they get jobs during and after their studies. Job awareness programs are organized in collaboration with many agencies of both governments and private organizations. As a result, most of the student got engagement during and after studies.

BASIC MENTAL HEALTH CONSELLING

Basic mental health conselling is provided to the students under District Mental Health Programme (DMHP), Govt. of Assam to overcome their anxiety, stress, fear, trauma and other phychological problems. A well furnished counselling room is available at the college to facilitate smooth counseling of the students.

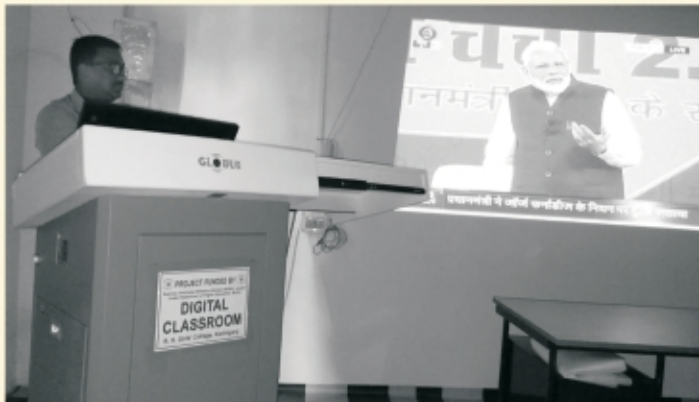
Apart from the above, NSS regularly observe national and international important days.

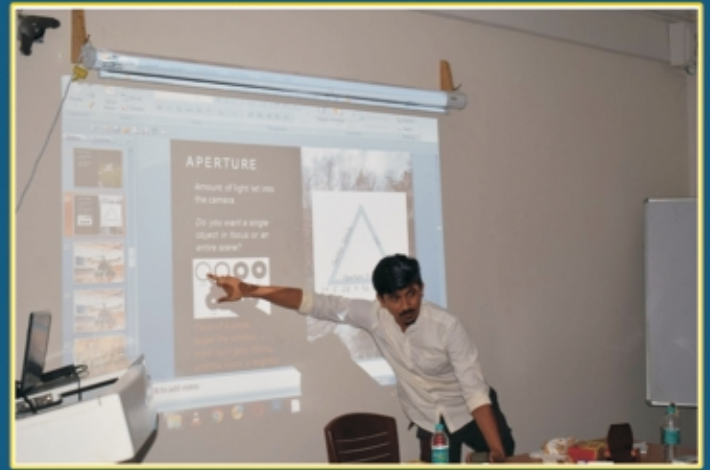
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
