

About Rabindrasadan Girls' College



Rabindrasadan Girls' College came into being in 1962 at the wake of the birth-centenary of the Nobel-Laureate and eminent scholar Rabindranath Tagore. Behind the establishment of the college was the commendable effort of founding fathers, who were primarily the members of the Tagore Centenary Committee of this district. Inspired by the lofty ideals of Tagore, the founding fathers of the college, felt the need for developing women education in this far-flung region of our country. Accordingly, this college was set up in 1962 utilizing the spare amount of the Tagore Centenary Committee and mass public donation

Beginning with a handful of departments, Rabindrasadan Girls' College, over the ages, has evolved into a full-fledged undergraduate institution imparting Higher Education to the women of the district as well as those of the neighbouring states. Located at the heart of the town, the college provides an ideal ambience and congenial environment for girls to pursue higher education.

The College could take its present form due to the tireless efforts and noble vision of many philanthropists, academicians and generous donors. The college humbly recognizes the immense debt it owes to them. The college endeavours to translate into practice the noble ideals that inspired its founding fathers.

Initially the college was affiliated to Gauhati University, Guwahati. The college obtained affiliation of Assam University, Silchar with its set up in 1994. At present, the college offers courses in Arts and Commerce Streams at both H.S. and Degree levels.

The college seeks to provide a healthy environment of studies to the girls who enrol in this institute and also strives to equip the students with essential skills and confidence to take on a world that is rapidly changing in every sphere. Finally, the college hopes to instil the sense of responsibility in the students so that they become better citizens and responsible members of the society. Rabindrasadan Girls' College has been reaccredited (third cycle) with Grade B (CGPA 2.39) by the National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC) in its latest assessment (September, 2024).

General Rules and Regulations of the College

Discipline

Students should follow rules and regulations of the College enunciated by the College Authority. College has Discipline & Anti-ragging committee which looks after the overall discipline maintained by the students within the campus.

Violation of rules, discourtesy to the teachers and staff members in any form, unruly behaviour, recourse to unfair means in examination etc. will lead to disciplinary action. Students who indulge in unruly behaviour within the campus will be reported to the Discipline Committee for necessary action. Any student who practices unfair means in the examination will be strictly dealt with as per the University/Council Rules.

Further, any student who breaks the law of the land within the campus will be booked as per law.

College Hour

Monday to Friday: 9:15 am to 4:00 pm Saturday: 9:15 am to 2:00 pm.

Dress Code / College Uniform

Students should come to the college with College Uniform (Pink color Churidar/Salwar-Kameez full-sleeved / half-sleeved with dupatta). Students shall not be allowed within the campus without uniform. Students are required to carry Photo-Identity Cards with them in the college campus.

Prohibition of Ragging

Ragging is strictly prohibited. As per prohibition of Ragging Act/Ordinance, the details of punishments for ragging are cited below:

Cancellation of admission, suspension from attending classes, termination / withholding of scholarship/ fellowship and other benefits, debarring from appearing examination, withholding of result, debarring from representing the institution and rigorous punishment up to three years.

However, the appropriate authority of the college can impose all the above punishments except the last one which can be imposed only by the court of law as per latest UGC and government guidelines. College has an Anti-Ragging Committee which takes care of preventing ragging inside the campus.

Anti-Drug Campaign

The college has an Anti-Drug Club that rigorously works for maintaining drug free environment within the college campus including the hostel. The Club has set up a Nesha Mukt Hostel Committee comprising of the Hostel Superintendent as the nodal officer, three teacher members with one being the counsellor and student volunteers. The prime objective of the committee is to monitor and curb abuse of drug and possession of illicit or narcotic substances within the campus. The Anti Drug Club, apart from monitoring the use, distribution and sale of illicit substances in the college campus, also organizes workshops, seminars, poster/banner presentation, slogan writing etc. for generating awareness about ill effects of drug addiction and alcohol consumption.

Campus Facilities

Hostel Facility

- The Rabindrasadan Girls' College has a three storied Girls' hostel with 120 seat capacity. The hostel affairs is managed by Hostel Superintendent who works under the aegis of Hostel Management Committee.
- The seats will be allotted to the borders on merit cum distance basis.
- Admitted students seeking hostel accommodation may apply in prescribed form within 10 days of admission along with a copy of marksheet, Address proof and xerox copy of fee card.
- Hostel admission fee is Rs. 6500/- at a time per year which includes a caution deposit of RS 500/- (refundable). The monthly mess fee is Rs 2000/- per month.
- Once a student is allotted hostel accommodation, she will have to abide by the rules and regulations of the Hostel framed by the Hostel Management Committee. Violation will lead to expulsion from the Hostel.
- The boarders are kept under the care of prefect(s) either nominated by the hostel management committee or elected by the boarders from among themselves. Prefects are responsible to take care of the boarders as well as ventilate the problems to the hostel management committee.
- Any student who is expelled from the college or debarred from appearing the examination would immediately be expelled from the hostel and her caution money will be forfeited. Hostel superintendent is Dr. Aparna Dhar.









Central Library

The College has a well-equipped Air-conditioned and digitized library with more than 19,500 text books and reference books. Besides, information resources in the form of journals, magazines, question papers, newspapers, syllabus, maps etc. are also available in the library. The library provides open access to the students so that they can select required materials easefully. A special collection books under book bank and remedial courses are provided to the (SC/ST) and minority students. Separate reading corners for the teachers and students are also available at the college library. The library also facilitates internet browsing, printing, and other reprographic services. Digitization and automation of the library is under process to facilitate remote access to the available resources.

Apart from regular subscription of print journals, the library also provides access to countless e-books and e-journals through Nlist Programme facilitated by INFLIBNET. Moreover, WhatsApp groups are being created at the initiative of the library to facilitate scanned soft copies of book-chapters, syllabus and question papers.



Library Facilities

Reading Room: The reading room has a sitting capacity of 50 persons.

Stack Section: The main collection of textbooks and fiction books are kept in the stack areas, with open access for both the teachers and students so that they can select books of their choice. **Reference and Rare book Section:** Library has 412 reference books and has a special collection of books on Kabiguru Rabindranath Tagore and many rare books on religion and folklore for use of students and scholars of this region.

Computer Section: There are 20 computers with internet facility where students can practice and prepare their assignments and access online and other electronic ejournals /e-books.

Faculty Corner: A separate table of 8 persons and a computer with internet facilities are provided to the faculty members of this college. Some interaction sessions are also arranged in the faculty corner of the library.

Archival and Scanning room: We are planning to start a digital library and for this purpose we are scanning the question papers, rare and fragile books, particular topics, college magazines etc. The scanned documents are sent in the WhatsApp group of students in the beginning of the session and on demand by teachers and students.

Periodical Section: Library has a regular subscription of 5 print journals / magazines and provides the back volumes of 17 journals.

Newspaper Section: Library has subscription to 2 newspapers namely the Dainik Jugasankha and the Times of India.

Library Timings: Library remains open on working days during college hour. On Sunday and Aadministrative holidays the library remains closed.

Gymnasium

The college has a gymnasium centre for students and staff. Students are encouraged to take physical exercises during off period. It is kept open for students during office hours.



Central Computer Laboratory

The college has a central computer laboratory which provides computer services to the students to work on their assignments and projects.

Smart Classrooms

The college has three smart classrooms equipped with projectors, podiums, advanced sound systems to provide enhanced learning environment by integrating digital tools and resources.







Girls' Common Room

A girls' common room is available in the college to provide seating facilities, washrooms and a designated space for students to relax, study or socialize.



Canteen

The college has a canteen for the students, faculty and staff that provides meals, snacks and beverages to meet the need of the campus community.

College Auditorium

The college has a air-conditioned auditorium with a capacity of 200 seats. It is equipped with advanced sound and light systems for holding meetings and functions. Installation of lift facility is on the anvil.



Student Cooperative

The college has opened R. S. Girls' College Common Service Centre Cooperative Society Ltd. The main objectives of the society are to promote the very objective of running a cooperative society among students, to provide various reprographic facilities for students and staff, to run canteen for students, teachers and office staff.



Other facilities —

- the college has 24-hour uninterrupted power back-up facility, drinking water plant, teachers' common room cum meeting hall.
- The college is planning to install an elevator/lift for the multi-storeyed buildings, a permanent Sahid Bedi and a dedicated conference hall.
- The college also is striving to acquire land for establishing a satellite campus for expansion of its academic reach and offer.







Courses Offered

Regular Courses

- Two year Higher Secondary Course in Arts and Commerce.
- Four Year Under Graduate (FYUG) Course in Arts and Commerce.

Skill Enhancement Certificate Courses

The college runs/proposes to run the following Skill Enhancement Certificate Courses for regular students of the college at a minimum course fee –

- Certificate Course in Computer Application (Six Month Duration).
- Certificate Course in Beauty and Wellness (Six Month Duration).
- Certificate Course in Art & Craft (Six Month Duration).

General rules/ guidelines for admission

- Admission will be strictly on the basis of merit. However, the admission committee with the approval of the principal may refuse admission to any applicant.
- Reservation of seats for SC, ST, OBC (non-creamy layer), Differently Abled (DA) and other categories will be applicable as per the Govt. of India and Govt. of Assam rules.
- Eligibility criteria in respect of marks will be relaxed by 5% for SC and ST candidates.
- Candidates seeking admission under the above-mentioned reserved category must submit a Caste Certificate/DA certificate with a photograph duly signed by the competent authority (D.C. or his nominee at the time of admission).
- If seats remain vacant from the reserved category/categories, then these will be filled up from among the applicants of general category.
- Candidates seeking admission under sports, cultural and NCC quota must submit proof of participation in the State/National/International level competitions.
- Candidates seeking admission under TGL and employee quota must also submit relevant certificates duly signed by the competent authority.
- Students having a gap year must specify it at the time of online form submission. Their selection will be made on the basis of merit and submission of an affidavit at the time of admission.
- Self-attested photocopies of certificates, mark sheets and other related documents along with all originals must be produced at the time of admission.
- Students passed through compartmental or supplementary examination in HSLC or equivalent examination will be considered for admission in Higher Secondary course subject to availability of seats.
- Students passed through compartmental or supplementary examination in HS or equivalent examination will not be considered for admission in FYUG course.



Admission to Higher Secondary First Year (2025-26)

Courses offered by the college

- Two year Higher Secondary Courses in Arts (Intake Capacity 200).
- Two year Higher Secondary Courses in Commerce (Intake capacity 150).

Eligibility criteria: HSLC or equivalent examination passed.

For registration and application applicants should visit the Assam State School Education Board (Division-II) run online portal DARPAN.

For schedule of admission and other notifications, students should visit time to time the notice board of DARPAN portal along with college website.

SL NO	INSTRUCTION FOR STUDENTS
1.	An Applicant has to submit application online through "DARPAN" Portal.
2.	A student can apply up to maximum of five (5) no. of applications.
3.	To edit profile of a student, he/she can visit the PROFILE TAB in the student dashboard before preparation of selection list by the institution. The profile of a student can be edited only once.
4.	The published Selection List and Waiting List for admission into HS first year will be made available in the DARPAN portal for the students. The students will be notified of their selection through SMS.
5.	After publication of selection list, candidates will be allowed to approve only one institution for admission using their login id in the portal. The candidate must take admission in the institution concerned within the stipulated time period to complete the admission process.
6.	A student will be able to change their preferred subject(s)/Stream at the time of admission. Students will be able to change their preferred subject(s)/Stream at the time of admission and the institution concerned will have to update the same in the portal on the day of admission.
7.	If a student does not accept the admission offer within stipulated time, the student will be removed from Selection List with information through SMS.
8.	If a student does not apply/select any institution within stipulated time of opening of DARPAN portal, the student's name/ profile will be disabled on the portal with information through SMS.
9.	Mobile number should be unique for registration of student on DARPAN portal. Same mobile cannot be used for multiple applications.
10.	Issuance of Gap permission certificate from ASSEB, DIV-II, for admission into HS 1st Year Class has been discontinued from the Session 2025-26. Students are advised to consult with institutions for their eligibility for admission.

Guidelines About Combination of Subjects

- There will be 6 compulsory subjects in total for all students.
- Subjects to be taken in each stream are divided in groups namely A, B, & C.
- A candidate shall opt all the Core subjects listed under part A and Elective subjects listed in Part B & C as specified.
- Each candidate has to opt 4[Four] elective subjects compulsorily. These elective subjects will be of 100 marks, may be with practical or without practical.
- In addition to the 4[Four] elective subjects, a candidate shall have to compulsorily study Environmental Education in Class XI and General Studies in Class XII for 50 marks each. The assessment of the subjects will be done internally (institution where studying) and Grade will be awarded.

Group A:

Mandatory core subject: English &

Either MIL (Bengali) or Alternative English

Group B (For Arts):

Students must choose any three from the following subjects offered by the college.

Advance Bengali, Education, History, Economics, Logic & Philosophy, Political Science, Sanskrit, Mathematics, Statistics, Computer Science & Application.

Group C (for Arts)

Students must choose any one from the following subjects offered by the college. Artificial Intelligence, Physical Education & Sports, Fine Arts, Accountancy & Auditing, Retail Trade.

Group B (for Commerce)

Students must choose minimum of three and a maximum of four Subjects from the following subjects offered by the college.

Accountancy, Business Studies, Business Mathematics & Statistics, Economics, Computer Science & Application, Mathematics, Statistics.

Group C (For Commerce)

Students may choose any one from the following subjects offered by the college. Artificial Intelligence, Physical Education & Sports, Fine Arts, Accountancy & Auditing, Retail Trade.

Important points to be noted:

- From Computer Science & Application and Artificial Intelligence, a candidate can opt only one subject.
- Commerce applicants can opt any one out of Statistics, Mathematics, Business Mathematics & statistics, a candidate can opt only any one subject.
- Arts applicants can opt for Advance Bengali provided that the Bengali is not taken as MIL.

N.B: Students are advised to go through Revised Academic Regulations for Higher Secondary Courses 2025 at the ASSEB (Div-II) website before choosing subjects.

Attendance and Internal Evaluation

- Students must have a minimum of 75% attendance of lectures delivered in each subject separately for attaining eligibility to appear in the Council Examinations.
- Students will have to seat and pass in two unit tests in each year to be eligible to appear at Final Examinations conducted by ASSEB(Div-II).

Four Year Under-Graduate (FYUG) Programme: Arts & Commerce

Programme of Study under NEP 2020

Four-Year Under Graduate Programme under NEP 2020 (FYUG) shall be a 8-semester programme of 4 (four) years' duration and, there shall be 4 types of Certifications based on Exit from the FYUG system *namely Certificate, Diploma, Three Years Bachelor's Degree and Four Years Bachelor's Degree with* Honours/ Honours and Research.

Multiple Lateral Entry and Exit

There shall be provision of multiple lateral entry as well as multiple exit with a Certificate/Diploma/3 Years Bachelor's Degree/ 4 Years Bachelor's Degree (Honours/ Honours and Research) under FYUG programme after earning the required credits with the fulfillment of all criteria for award. Those students who have exited from FYUG with a Certificate/Diploma/ Bachelor's degree may return back into the FYUG programme for admission to the immediate next higher semester within a total of 7 years from the date of admission to the First Semester provided he/she has to complete the course within the stipulated times otherwise lateral entry shall NOT be permitted.

Eligibility Criteria

For admission to FYUG course students must be Higher Secondary or equivalent examination passed in respective stream (Arts or Commerce).

Admission Procedure

Students seeking admission in 1st Semester of Four Years undergraduate courses (FYUG) are to register and upload their profile in the Samarth admission portal. Students have to opt for institutions and programmes and complete the process of registration within the schedule notified by Department of Higher Education, Govt. of Assam. For registering, students should visit the Samarth admission portal:

https://assamadmission.samarth.ac.in

N.B: For the academic session 2025-26, 90% seats will be reserved for non-CUET (UG) applicants and 10% for CUET(UG) applicants. The basis of admission for the students of non-CUET (UG) will be the merit in the HS or equivalent Examination. The basis for admission with CUET will be the merit in the CUET(UG).

Key Information for Students Regarding Admission

- Complete application form in all respects, must be submitted online on or before the last date of submission.
- Necessary documents must be uploaded online while submitting the form. The College will not entertain any incomplete application or application submitted after the last date of submission.



- Applications without relevant documents will be rejected.
- No Registration Fees: Accessing prospectus on the portal or websites will not require any additional fees.
- There is no registration fee for admission via the Samarth portal or institutional websites.
- Students will only pay the prescribed admission fees, as per the uniform fee structure approved by the Government of Assam, for regular courses and shall pay actual fee amount for the self-financed courses as applicable.
- Students eligible for Fee waiver will apply accordingly.
- Dates of admission will be notified in due course of time in the SAMARTH portal/website of Higher Educational Institutions.

Course Structure

Courses in FYUG programme of study may be of 08 (Eight) types —

- i) Discipline Specific Core (DSC)
- ii) Discipline Specific Minor (DSM)
- iii) Inter Disciplinary Course (IDC)
- iv) Ability Enhancement Course (AEC)
- v) Skill Enhancement Course (SEC)
- vi) Value Added Course (VAC)
- vii) Dissertation/ Project
- viii) Internship

Discipline Specific Core (DSC):

This is the course which is to be compulsorily studied by a student as a core subject to complete a programme in a specific discipline of study.

Discipline Specific Minor (DSM):

The courses offered under the main discipline of study are referred to as Discipline Specific Minor Courses. From Discipline Specific Minor, students shall take two subjects related to his/her discipline. All DSM course shall be stand alone and students can select first minor subject and second minor subject according to their choice.

Interdisciplinary Courses (IDC):

Three interdisciplinary courses i.e. IDC-101, IDC-151 and IDC-201 with 3(three) credits each shall be studied in the entire FYUG programme in First Semester, Second Semester and Third Semester respectively. There are 04 baskets viz: Natural Sciences (NS), Social Sciences (SS), Humanities (HN) and Commerce & Management (CM). Students may opt for any one from those 04 baskets in each of I, II and III semester. For students of colleges having multiple streams, choice of IDC shall preferably be from a discipline other than his/her own discipline.

Ability Enhancement Courses (AEC):

Ability Enhancement Courses are the compulsory courses and are based upon content that leads to knowledge enhancement. These are mandatory for all disciplines.

Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC):

The SEC Courses opted in 1st Semester shall remain same for all three semesters. Semester- wise change of SEC is not allowed. However, in case of change of DSC and DSM subjects in 3rd semester, change of SEC may be considered subject to fulfillment of other conditions. The SECs are the compulsory value based and/or skill-based aimed at providing hands-on- training, skills, etc. The main purpose of these courses is to provide students life-skills in hands-on mode so as to increase their employability.



Value Added Course (VAC):

This is also common to all FYUG students of 1st and 2nd Semester. This course comprises of NSS, NCC, DTS, Sports, HW, Yoga, GCS and UI. NSS, NCC. Sports and Yoga courses comprise of both theory and practical components and remaining subjects are without practical component.

Dissertation/ Project Work:

Dissertation/ Project Work is considered as a special course involving application of knowledge in solving/ analyzing /exploring a real-life situation/ difficult problem. A Dissertation/ Project Work is an optional paper and in lieu of Project /Dissertation in VIII semester, students shall have option to take three additional courses as Discipline Specific Courses which will be equal to 12 credits in total.

Internship / Community Engagement/ Field Work:

This is a new and significant component of FYUG programme under NEP 2020. The course is a compulsory 2 credit course for 5th Semester students of all Disciplines under FYUGP as per UGC guideline. In this component there are three alternatives *viz*., Internship, Community Engagement and Field Work.

FYUG Programme

There shall be Four Programme of study under FYUG programme -

- One Year Certificate Course in <u>Subject</u> (DSC paper) after successfully completion of One year study without any arrear(s) with earnings of 40 credit in total.
- **Two Years Diploma Course** in <u>Subject</u> (DSC paper) after successfully completion of 02(two) years study without any arrear(s) with earnings of 80 credit in total.
- Three Years Bachelor's Degree under FYUG programme after successful completion of 03(three) years study without any arrear(s) with earnings of 120 credit in total.
- Four Years Bachelor's Degree with Honours/Honours & Research after successful completion of four years study without any arrear(s) with earnings of 160 credit in total.


